Pastor's Note (March 2024)

"Are we there yet?" I hear whining and complaining from my impatient kids every time we are on a road trip for too long. We are still in the season of Lent and with Holy Week quickly coming in the next few weeks. Easter Sunday is on the horizon, and it is easy at this point to look at our spiritual journey ahead and ask, "Are we there yet?"

It is tempting to rush from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday with little attention given to the significance of the suffering Christ throughout Holy Week— the seriousness of betrayal, passion, suffering and death of Jesus on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

We do not want to see Jesus being betrayed, arrested and beaten up. We do not want to see Jesus bloodied on a cross. We don't like the sound of the whips, the shame, the blood, the tears, and the agony of Good Friday. It disturbs our modern sensibilities and makes our old nature squirm. We would rather hear stories of glory and triumph, not humiliation and defeat.

Rather than wondering if we are there yet, we should spend this week paying attention to the road that is preparing us for Holy Week. As followers of Christ, the crucifixion of Jesus is the very core of what we believe. It is the climax of Jesus' mission and purpose to humanity. At the cross, Jesus conquered sin, death and even the devil. And so, we do not avoid Holy Week and the cross, but at the same time, we do not shrink the entire Christian faith into Good Friday. Instead, we understand everything in life through the lens of what Jesus did for us at the cross. In other words, we cannot fully understand Easter without Good Friday, just as we cannot fully understand new life and resurrection without first knowing suffering and death.

Therefore, instead of rushing to the Easter celebration that lies ahead, I encourage everyone not to miss any Sunday this Lent. And to continue journeying together from Lent to Holy Week leading up to the glorious Easter Sunday.

REI racialequityinstitute

REI's two-day Phase 1 training is designed to develop the capacity of participants to better understand racism in its institutional and structural forms. Moving away from a focus on personal bigotry and bias, this workshop presents a historical, cultural, and structural analysis of racism. With shared language and a clearer understanding of how institutions and systems are producing unjust and inequitable outcomes, participants should leave the training better equipped to begin to work for change.

Recently, Benson Memorial UMC received a <u>Peace</u> <u>with Justice grant</u> from the NC Conference Board of Church and Society to hold a Racial Equity Institute (REI) training. The grant helped to reduce the cost of the training from \$375 to \$85 per person.

The training will be held <u>March 21-22, 2024</u>, in Benson Memorial UMC's Fellowship Hall. Sponsored by Raleigh Organizing Against Racism, the workshop moves away from a focus on personal bigotry and bias to a historical, cultural, and structural analysis of racism.

What is General Conference?

General Conference is the top policy-making body of The United Methodist Church. The conference meets to consider revisions to church law and to adopt resolutions on current moral, social, public policy, and economic issues. General Conference also approves plans and budgets for churchwide agencies and programs.

Delegates are United Methodists from around the world elected by their annual, missionary, or provisional conference. The total number of delegates at General Conference ranges between 600 and 1,000 people.

The body of General Conference consists of an equal number of lay and clergy delegates. Lay members of annual conferences elect the lay delegates, and clergy members elect clergy delegates.

Located 7 miles from the Charlotte International Airport, the Convention Center is accessible from I-85, I-77, and U.S. Highway 74. The city has a 19.3-mile light rail system known as the LYNX Blue Line connecting the southern and northern parts of Charlotte.

The 600,000-square-foot facility recently completed an expansion project to add meeting space and an exterior over-street pedestrian walkway that connects to several stores, hotels, and the LYNX Blue Line Stonewall Station.

Within walking distance are approximately 200 restaurants and numerous art, history, and science museums, galleries, and theaters.

Charlotte also has a network of greenways, parks, and other outdoor spaces and hosts sporting events including NFL football, NBA basketball, hockey, baseball, NASCAR, soccer, and more.
